## DaChan Bay Terminals handles second-hand Boeing 747 aircraft

The aircraft was separated into 10 units of 40-foot container and 14 units of break-bulk cargo including the nose cone, wings, and tail. A special work team, with all the necessary equipment to handle all sorts of cargoes, was formed to ensure a safe and quick unloading of this special cargo. In addition, the DaChan Bay Terminals team worked closely with the local authorities to ensure a smooth and swift customs clearance.

Covering an area of 112 hectares, DaChan Bay Terminals operates seven berths with a total quay length of 2,430 metres. Its water depth alongside is currently -15.5 metres and will eventually be dredged to -18 metres, catering for the world's largest container vessels. ### Other Break Bulk Project Cargo handled at DaChan Bay:

- Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge Steel Project: Handled a total of 4,000 tonnes of supplied materials with cargo dimensions of 3,800 x 50 x 50cm
- Boarding Bridge Export: DCB has been handling this kind of shipments for a long time. Each bridge is about 20 metres in length and weights about 35 tonnes.
- Metro carts to Hong Kong: Shipments were originated from Ningbo and each cart measures 2,388.5 x 312 x 381.5cm and weights 43 tonnes.
- Other shipments include diesel engines, autoclave and high-speed boat.
