

Marguisa releases Calabar Port in Nigeria

The harbour receives its first container vessel from the Spanish shipping company

Marguisa, the Spanish maritime operator specialized in West Africa, successfully docked its first container ship in the Port of Calabar in Nigeria last Monday, September 23.

The shipping company opens its regular service to Calabar, as a result of the agreement signed with the local authorities of the Nigerian port last year.

The Marguisa service to Calabar -*Marguisa Calabar Service (MCS)*- offers biweekly arrival using Malabo in Equatorial Guinea as a Hub. This new service completes and expands its regular service with West Africa from ports all around the world using its main weekly service- *Marguisa Africa Service (MAS)*- as cornerstone.

With this new service Marguisa opens a new corridor for maritime transport, which makes Calabar a gateway for the states of Cross River and Akwa Ibom and creates a new logistic access to eastern Nigeria.
